Princess Anne Alumnae Chapter and Census 2020



The Maryland State Social Action Coordinator has issued a statement for all chapters to educate and encourage a complete count for Census 2020. Excerpts from her wonderfully written opening letter to the toolkit – “The 2020 Census is almost upon us, and we have work to do. As you know, this population count, which occurs every decade, provides critical data for all communities. It affects the distribution of federal funding, redistricting for purposes of legislative representation, and community planning for a range of services, including education, roads, and housing. Through this initiative, every Maryland Chapter of Delta Sigma Theta Sorority, Inc., with a majority of members participating, is expected to do the following to promote and

encourage full community participation in responding timely to the 2020 Census:” Princess Anne Alumnae is responding to this important initiative with vigor, targeting to exceed the county participation statistics from the 2010 and 2000:

The chapter Census sub-committee of Social Action, is lead by chapter member Sonya Whited, who is co-chair of the Wicomico County-City of Salisbury Complete Count Committee (CCC) - a US Census recommended group to promote a full count of the decennial census) and a member of the Maryland State DST Social Action Census Marketing subcommittee (thenewsletters from this effort are available on our chapter website at <https://www.paacdst.org/census2020>).

Princess Anne Alumnae Chapter Co-host a Virtual Town Hall: Civic Responsibilities for Wicomico County Amid COVID 19

April 30th was a great virtual town hall full of relevant information about Primary Elections and the 2020 Census in our county and beyond in our current “normal”. We know that with physical distancing and mandates in our state, things have changed, so we wanted to inform our neighbors. This event was hosted by Wicomico County - City of Salisbury Complete Count Committee (CCC), Delta Sigma Omega Chapter of Alpha Kappa Alpha Sorority, Incorporated, and Princess Anne Alumnae Chapter of Delta Sigma Theta Sorority, Inc.

Mayor Jacob Day, Mayor of Salisbury MD kicked us off with an update about COVID-19 implications and latest news in our area. He ended with the importance of a complete count in our community. This was followed by Wicomico County Board of Directors who informed us about the details and timing of the mail ballots, the drop off boxes, and the in- person stations that will be available on the June 2nd primary. NOTE: Paper ballots are being mailed starting May 1st and the period of response - via mail or drop off boxes is between May 21st and June 2nd.

The remaining session included #2020census information. We started with information from our U.S. Census Partner who updated us on revised dates and other federal facts; followed by our Maryland State Census partner who shared state updates and information. This introduction was followed by a local update from Soror Sonya Whited, co-chair of Wicomico County CCC, which included details about our individual census tract response rates that combine into our overall rate.


The highlight of this meeting is the phenomenal work of the Wicomico County Maryland Department of Planning, Zoning, & Community Development GIS department! They have developed detailed maps that includes places of worship and businesses throughout the county as well as an interactive tool that takes you down to the street level within our county. This tool is the source of the weekly, sometimes twice a week, snapshot our county progress.

The town hall also served as a kick-off for our next effort to promote the 2020 Census and have some fun doing it. This is a virtual art contest for two age groups, (1) under 18 years of age - visual art submission with the topic why Census is important/ why does it matter and (2) 18 years of age and older - up to 30 second submission of their experience completing the Census. The event which is open from May 1st to May 30th and submissions are through the very active Wicomico County-City of Salisbury CCC webpage. After review the newest event, two random call participant were each award a \$25 gift card to their choice of Salisbury restaurants. This is a program developed by City of Salisbury, Maryland to help our local restaurants in this challenging time.



On November 14th, our chapter joined forces with the Worcester County CCC to attend their Families and Schools Together night at Snow Hill High School where our chapter member Dr. Kimberly Purvis' is the Principal. We had fun informing attendees about the importance of the census, what to expect and not to expect on the questionnaire through a counting contest where the prize was a jar of candy.

On January 9th the two chapters - Sonya Whited, chapter Census 2020 subcommittee chair and Dionne Church, Vice Basilius of Delta Sigma Omega Chapter of Alpha Kappa Alpha Sorority, Inc and Director at Wicomico County Board of Elections had a Great night sharing information about Voter Registration and Census 2020 with local Greek organizations. Attendees were trained on voter registration by the office in preparation to register when hosting their commu-



nity events. After reviewing the form and ensuring all details were covered, the Census presentation focused on the confidentiality of this constitutional decennial action and the importance of an accurate count. The session was educational and provided key information to those who can share it in our local community. The chapter had a great morning at the youth activity with well over 300 attendees! The chapter, working with Wicomico County Complete County Committee (CCC) and

US Census Job recruiters, promoted the importance of the complete count with information and our Complete Count Candy Jar. The chapter activities included coloring books, puzzles and the second annual on-site essay contest with this year's theme "Dr. Martin Luther King Jr. "I have a Dream" speech is important today because....". Congratulations to the winners - 1st place - DeVane Williams, 2nd Place - Trinity Cephas, 3rd place - Alaynah Martin; all participants in the contest received a book bag from Extraordinary League of Gentlemen, Inc.!



Delta Day in Annapolis

Delta Day in Annapolis was held on Monday, February 10th in the Miller Senate Office Building. Our Chapter Social Action Chair, Soror Vanice Antrum served as one of the Co-Chairs for this year's event. Over 150 sorors from across the state including 4 from Princess Anne Alumnae showed up to gain information on topics such as Education, Human Trafficking, Combatting Poverty, Politics, and Vaping & Opiates. Panelists ranged from government officials, to community activities, to CEOs of non-profit organizations sharing information that Sorors could take back to their chapters and implement in their communities. The day started with two dynamic speakers from the Black and Missing Foundation, Inc. talking about the importance of paying attention to the signs of human trafficking and the importance of making sure our communities know that

traffickers can look just like the people they are used to seeing in their neighborhoods so it is key to be vigilant. Panelists on the Understanding the Kirwan Commission informed attendees about the upcoming changes to K-12 education across the state and the impact the changes will have on various communities. In the Combating Poverty in our communities session, we were educated on the various ways poverty can have an effect on the community including jobs readiness,



homelessness, food insecurity, education, and more. It was important to hear that poverty looks more than what we are usually used to seeing and how we can push legislation and community programs to support. The Political Panel taught us a lot about being an informed voter and the power of partnerships to ensure a complete count in the 2020 census. Panelists also shared the importance of making sure you research candidates both new and those who have been in office for a long time to make sure that you are choosing the candidate most aligned with your needs, not just your party. Our final panel focused on the issues of Vaping and Opiates. The panelists were very knowledgeable about the specific affects these issues are having in Maryland and what legislation is out there to prevent our youth from continuing to fall victim to drug use. Not only did we have a wonderful program of panelists, we were blessed to have some notable Deltas in the room as well. Our 16th Past National President, Dr. Thelma T. Daley brought greetings in addition to our Maryland State Coordinator, Debbie Tijani, and our Eastern Regional Director, Rosia Blackwell-Lawrence. Our closing speaker was none other that our National Social Action Commission Co-chair, Rev. Shavone Arline-Bradley who gave us an inspiring message that energized Sorors to take all they learned throughout the day and put it into action. Delta Day in Annapolis is always such a wonderful experience because the legislators know Delta Sigma Theta. They are ready to engage with us because they know beyond this one day, Deltas are doing the work in the community and have the ability to make change. We were greeted by the Speaker of the House - Del. Adrienne Jones, Speaker Pro Tem – Del. Sheree Sample-Hughes, President of the Legislative Black Caucus – Del. Darryl Barnes, and countless other Delegates including three members of Delta Sigma Theta. The day was even more special because Sorors were able to witness the unveiling of two new statues in the statehouse honoring Frederick Douglas and Harriet Tubman, something that many legislators of color in our state never thought they would see. We are proud to have had another successful Delta Day in Annapolis, and look forward to participating again in 2021.

Delta GEMS



As per the last 10 years, our Award Winning and highly rated Delta GEMS program is planned and going strong with 15 young ladies. The program kicked off this year at New Dimensions Ministries in Salisbury, MD on Monday, October 21, 2019 with an overview of the program separate sessions for the participants and their parents. The young ladies had a session on college prep led by Soror Studivant and student, Leah Swindler, where they learned about specifics of a local

college (UMES) as well as general information necessary for admission to a university post graduation. Simultaneously, the parents attended What's the 411? Session led by Soror Purvis and Soror Taylor that included a discussion of their expectations both for the program and their child, bridging home and school to help their child be successful, and creating a graduation game plan. For the month of November – the session held on November 4th, was with the young ladies discussing #SecuringTheBag - Financial Literacy. Starting with a fireside chat, the main topic included Dr. Deidre Johnson from Junior Achievement taught a lesson on budgeting and money management. The November service learning project was held at the Lower Shore Shelter in Princess Anne, MD on Monday, November 18, 2019 where the GEMS sorted and separated donations and toiletries, cleaned the kitchen drawers, and created paper product welcome kit. December is the month of two service learning projects that has become an annual tradition for the Delta GEMS program. (1) On Monday, December 2, 2019 the Maryland State Police Barracks X in Princess Anne, MD where the young ladies wrapped and bagged gifts to be given

out at the Somerset County Winter Wonderland event for the less fortunate in local community on Saturday, December 14, 2019. This is the fourth year of this partnership. The second December service learning project was held at the Centre of Salisbury in partnership with the Salvation Army's Red Kettle Campaign. Here the attendees attracted people to the kettles ringing the bells, and offering a joyous atmosphere for the shop-



holiday season. The January session held on Monday, January 6, 2020 was titled #TheFutureIsFemale where Lieutenant Colonel Latisha Lewis of the Maryland National Guard taught an interactive lesson on leadership. January 27, 2020 included community service learning project in collaboration with Project Hygiene. The participants discussed the impact of bullying and created hygiene bags for Pocomoke High School's hygiene closet and posters to decorate the closet. February started with community service – working the registration table at the annual Princess Anne Alumnae Zumbathon on February 1st.

The next month on November 2, 2019, Soror Nelquisha Pitts participated in the Alzheimer's Walk at the MAC center in Salisbury, MD. The chapter raised \$250 to donate to the organization. On February 1, 2020 At Salisbury University, Princess Anne Alumnae Chapter partnered with the Nu Rho chapter, to host the annual Zumbathon lead by our fabulous instructor Dee! 
